

A trip to Headhunters Barber Shop & Railway Museum is like taking a remarkable journey into the past, bringing the golden age of steam vividly to life. Established in 2002, with the help of former railway employees and enthusiasts, the museum's purpose is to collect, preserve and interpret local railway heritage.

Starting at the Booking Office, where the ticket collector invites you to step on board, your journey recreates railway travel throughout Fermanagh and the border counties until the closure of the lines in 1957, with lovingly created exhibits like the Station Master's Office and Signal Box.

This fascinating historical exhibition looks at the impact which railways had on people's lives. At a time when the local railway station was the gateway to the wider world, it reveals how railways stimulated exports, encouraged people to go on seaside holidays and brought a greater variety of goods to the shops.

You will find an absorbing range of railway memorabilia, including uniforms, signalling instruments, locomotive nameplates, crests, lamps, tableware, timetables, tickets and photographs from the three railway companies which operated in County Fermanagh – The Great Northern Railway (Ireland), The Sligo Leitrim & Northern Counties Railway and The Clogher Valley Railway.

This museum is an historic gem which is continually being enhanced with new exhibits, many kindly donated by former railway employees. Visitors can affectionately recall the memories, excitement and emotional appeal associated with the bygone age of steam travel.
